6. Bonneville Shoreline Trail Update

As part of the Parley's Pointe development agreement, at the completion of the construction of the community infrastructure (but not the homes) the city will receive ~300 acres of land as permanent open space. The BST Committee is making plans for construction across this plot to connect the trail from the north to the Parley's Canyon section. John Knoblock updated us on the timing of the project, planning the trail, and the construction needs. The completion of the trail will require about \$100,000.

We asked the residents in attendance if they were in favor of the completion of the BST through the Parleys Pointe development. Two residents were not in favor of the trail, out of an estimated 30 residents in attendance.

- Established in 1876
- Department of Salt Lake City municipal government
- Water provider for more than 360,000 people in Salt Lake City, Mill Creek, Holladay, Cottonwood Heights, and other communities
- Sewer, stormwater, and street lighting for Salt Lake City
- Regulated by the US EPA and Utah DEQ pursuant to the Clean Water Act and Safe Drinking Water Act; Utah DNR for water rights

Current Water-Related Infrastructure

3 water treatment plants

1 sewer treatment plant

31 pump stations

7 water storage dams and reservoirs

32 water distribution reservoirs and tanks

1,307.62 miles of water lines

654.38 miles of sewer collection lines

349.72 miles of stormwater collection lines



Water Lines

- **Age**
 - 57% 1960-2019; 43% pre 1960
 - 15.5% pre-1920
- **Size**
 - Most common sizes 6", 8", and 12"
 - 1"-72"
- **Type**
 - Most common are ductile iron and cast iron pipe (61.5%)
 - PVC (13.7%)
 - Steel, asbestos cement, concrete, brick still in existence

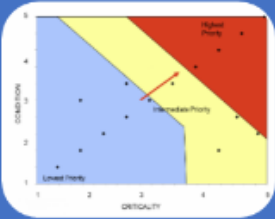

Capital Asset Program



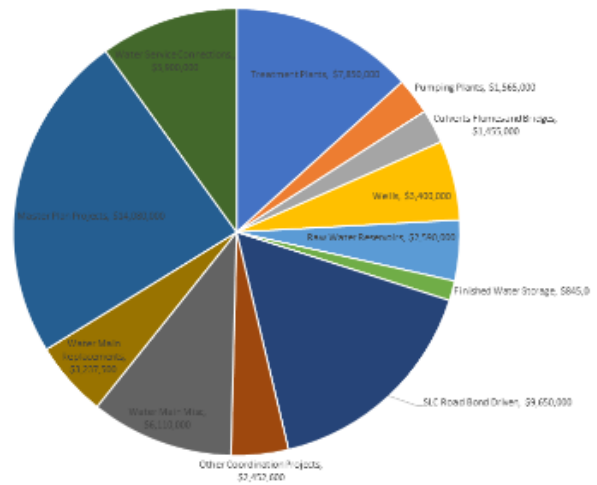
CIP Project Delivery

Water Capital Budget 2020

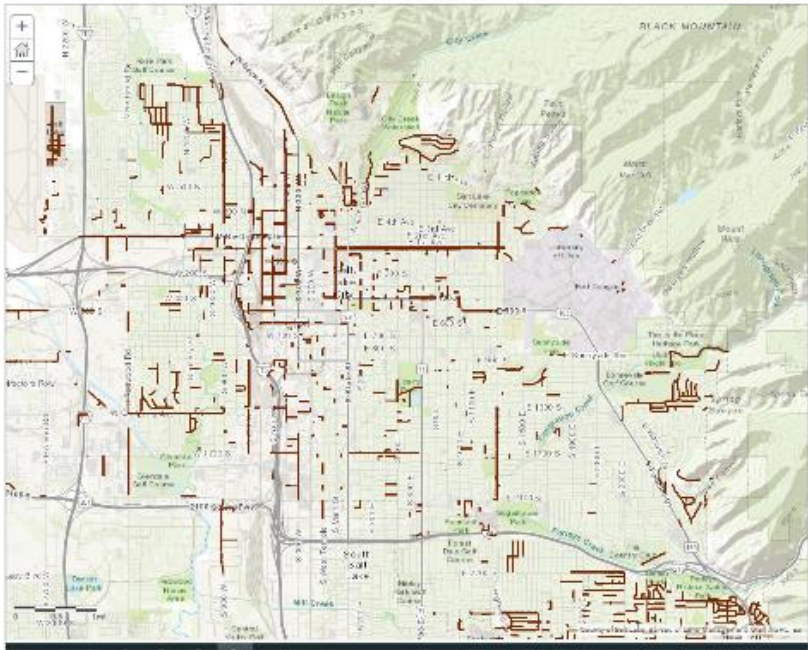

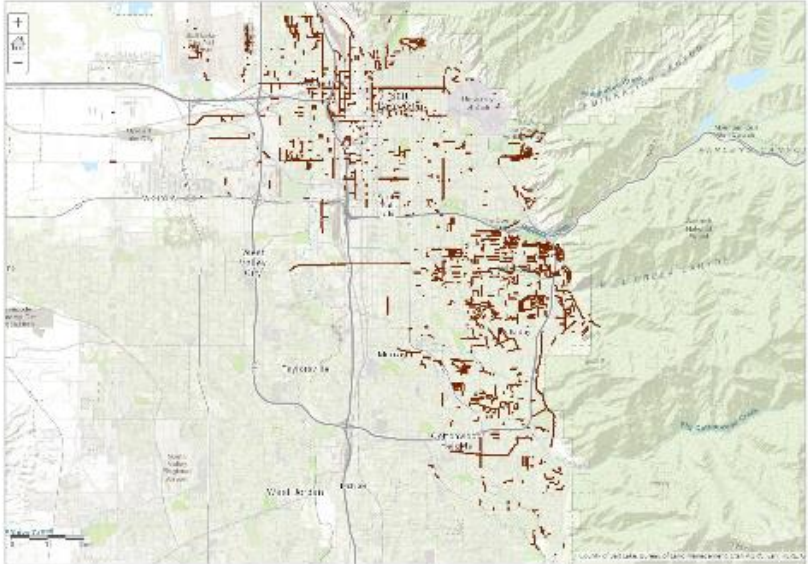

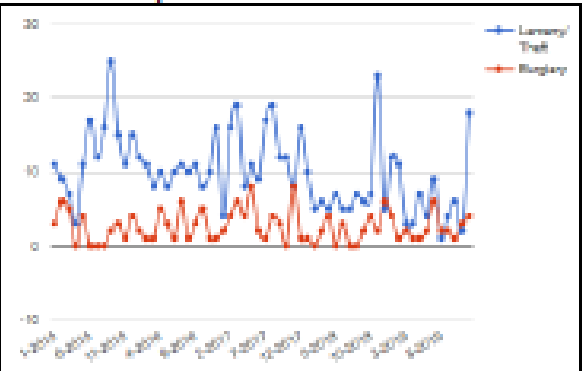

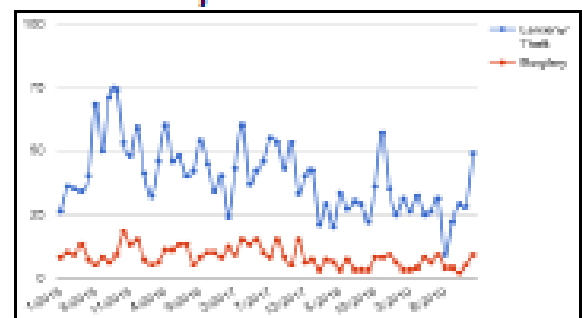
