

## General Meeting minutes of EBCC Board June 15 , 2022

Attendance: Present, Anthony Wright, David Leta, Catherine Bullock. Excused, Katie Moore, Joan Ogden, Jason Cowen, Mark Overdevest.

### **New Business:**

Detective Fowles had a conflict and sent the crime report to Anthony Wright.

Councilman Dan Dugan reported :

1. The city council passed the budget last night. We should expect a tax increase.
2. Right now water conservation is on a volunteer basis but the issue is serious and restrictions are likely to follow.
3. Many concerns are before the council: Affordable housing, homelessness solutions, air and water quality.
4. Dan spoke with the developers of Lamplighter Square. They intend to create a buffer along the east boundary between the neighboring residences and their project. They plan to have a right in right out turn from Foothill Drive. Presently they will leave the apartment buildings. The Skyline Inn access from 17<sup>th</sup> South has not been determined yet and is contingent on decisions made by DBAC and their plans for the liquor store.

David Leta reported that the Parleys Mine issue is in the courts and working through the legal process.

Anthony Wright introduced our new representative from the Mayor's Office Hannah Barton. She gave us the following updates:

1. Fireworks restrictions will be enforced East of 900 East and North of South Temple. The map of restrictions can be found online at [SLC.gov/fire](http://SLC.gov/fire) for July 4<sup>th</sup> and July 24<sup>th</sup>.
2. Salt Lake City is one of 18 cities looking at building our renewable energy by 2030 in cooperation with Rocky Mountain Power.  
The city has a new Adopt a Storm Drain volunteer program created to help keep our water cleaner.
